
Victoria Cross dot-to-dot

The Victoria Cross



The Victoria Cross is also known as the V.C. It was the highest award for bravery a person serving with the Commonwealth forces, including Canadians, could receive during the First World War.



It is called the Victoria Cross because it is in the shape of a cross. It was also presented by the Queen Victoria.



The Victoria Cross was first introduced in the 1850's.



Who?

During the First World War, 73 Canadians and Newfoundlanders were awarded the Victoria Cross, including a teenager named Thomas Ricketts, in October 1918.



The Victoria Cross was made in London, England, and the metal came from old cannons.
