OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST

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As an occupational therapist with Veterans

The Job

Occupational therapists provide occupational therapy services to geriatric and psychogeriatric Veterans living in a long term care facility (Ste. Anne's Hospital) and other Veterans living in the community. They provide consultation services to various stakeholders, such as multidisciplinary teams, various committees and working groups, and families of residents. Finally, they provide training for occupational therapy interns from various universities.

The Focus

Occupational therapists:

- conduct an assessment of hospitalized clients and provide them with the appropriate occupational therapy treatment.
- plan, provide, coordinate and follow up on occupational therapy treatment and interventions.
- evaluate, prescribe and adapt technological aids and provide follow up.
- plan, develop, design, implement and evaluate occupational therapy programs.
- attend and participate in multidisciplinary meetings, various committees and internal and external working groups.
- develop, lead and organize training sessions regarding various clinical problems for caregivers, volunteers, families and interns.
- supervise the clinical training of occupational therapy interns.
- monitor the clinical work of occupational therapy technicians and with clients.

- plan and coordinate the services of various teams of external consultants (the Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec's (RAMQ) mobile positioning clinic, private and public driver evaluation clinics, the Société de l'assurance automobile du Québec (SAAQ) for disabled parking permits, etc.)
- direct or collaborate in various research projects and assist in implementation and collection of relevant data.

The Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in occupational therapy from a recognized university.
- Member in good standing of the Ordre des ergothérapeutes du Québec.
- Ability to work effectively on an interdisciplinary team.
- Experience in a geriatric or psychogeriatric environment is an asset.
